What is the Daily Bread? Who is the Daily Bread?

Exodus 16:2- 5 "In the desert the whole community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. ³ The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the Lord's hand in Egypt! There we sat around pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death."⁴ Then the Lord said to Moses, "I will rain down bread from heaven for you. **The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day.** In this way I will test them and see whether they will follow my instructions. ⁵ On the sixth day they are to prepare what they bring in, and that is to be twice as much as they gather on the other days."

Also, **Exodus 16:17** "The Israelites did as they were told; some gathered much, some little. ¹⁸ And when they measured it by the omer, the one who gathered much did not have too much, and the one who gathered little did not have too little. Everyone had gathered just as much as they needed."

"God gives us what we need Not what we want."

John 6:35 "Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

The Greek word for Sin is: Hemertema: Missing the mark, lost the Path. Not together with. "It is out of alignment of what should be." Any thing that is out of alignment is Sin. Sin or Evil are not the same thing evil is a result of sin.

The Lords Prayer where it states Give us our Daily Bread is a reminder. That we don't have to do this life on our own. This is an opportunity to invite Him (Christ) into whatever you are facing.
