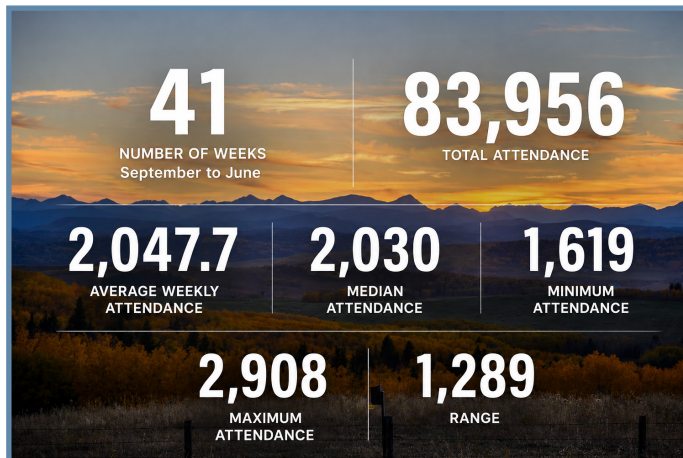
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Senior Pastor's Report

This year has seen significant growth in the life of our church. We have welcomed many new individuals and families, and witnessed God at work through changed lives, meaningful relationships, and expanding ministry opportunities. Each week, I am reminded that Southview is more than a place where we gather – it is a community seeking to passionately follow Jesus and help others do the same.



ATTENDANCE - SEPTEMBER TO JUNE

Throughout the year, it was encouraging to see attendance at our services remain consistently strong, with most weekends welcoming approximately 2,000 - 2,100 people. While attendance naturally varied from week to week, we also experienced several significant gatherings, including weekends of 2,379 and 2,908, reminding us of the many opportunities God continues to provide to welcome people, worship together, and grow as a church community.

FORWARD PROJECT

In May we launched our FORWARD project as an expression of our belief that God is calling Southview to grow through both expansion and multiplication. The proposed addition of a gym and ministry spaces will create much needed room to disciple and empower the next generation and serve our surrounding community in new ways.

At the same time, we sensed a growing call to extend beyond our current location by planting and partnering with churches across Calgary, particularly in communities where congregations need renewed strength and support. The FORWARD project reflects our desire to grow by going – investing in future leaders, strengthening communities, and helping more people passionately follow Jesus.

STAFFING UPDATE

This past year brought significant changes to our staff team. We said goodbye to **Sydney** and **Devon** from Youth Ministry, Jodie from Community and Global Engagement, and **Spencer** from Children's Ministry. We are thankful for the ways each of them served Southview and invested in the life of our church. There is no doubt they love the Lord and his Church, and we pray God's blessing over them wherever He leads them.

We also marked the retirement of long-time team member **Nadine**, who served as our Parish Nurse for nearly 17 years before stepping away from her role at Southview in December. We are deeply grateful for the many years she invested in our Care Ministry

and for the compassion and support she provided to so many within our church and community.

Alongside these departures, we are grateful to welcome several members to our team. In September, **Katelyn** joined us as Junior High Pastor and now serves as the Associate Pastor of Student Ministry. In November, **Daniel** joined the team as our much-needed Technical Director, and in March, we welcomed **Jason** as our new Student Ministry Pastor.

We are thankful for each of them and the contributions they made to ministry at Southview.

And finally, we are happy to announce we have hired **Simon** as Pastor of Small Groups & Connections, **Bob** as Pastor of Local and Global Engagement, and **Candace** as our Next Gen Admin Assitant. We are grateful for the people God continues to bring to our team and look forward to how He will use each of them here at Southview.

STAFF RETREAT

This past June, our staff was blessed with an overnight retreat in Canmore on June 2 & 3, marking the first full staff retreat in nine years. There has been much change over the past years, so it was very meaningful to step away from our regular rhythms, strengthen relationships, worship together, and simply enjoy being together as a team.



We are grateful for the generosity of our church for the way it allowed us to get to know one another as individuals and as a team, encourage one another, and return to ministry with a shared purpose.

Operations

PRAYER

This past year has been another year for which we have much to be grateful. We have seen growth at Southview—not only in attendance or giving, but also in the joy of serving together and participating in the work God is doing through His church.

One of the things we have been intentionally reminding ourselves of within the Operations Team this year is that we are not simply supporting ministry from behind the scenes—we are participating in the ministry of the church. Whether we are balancing a budget, clearing snow, repairing a door, answering an email, fixing a computer, processing an invoice, or cleaning a classroom, even the most ordinary or tedious task can become an opportunity to worship God and bring Him glory. It is a privilege for our Ops Team to use the gifts, resources, and responsibilities entrusted to us to help Southview fulfill its mission of leading as many as possible to passionately follow Jesus.

It takes an incredible amount of work to care for our building and property throughout the year. A **66,000** square-foot facility and surrounding land requires significant attention, planning, maintenance, and financial resources to remain safe, welcoming, functional, and ready for ministry seven days a week.

Our team has been hard at work this year, and there are many people whose faithful service deserves recognition.

IT:

I am grateful for Mark Michaud and the significant work he has done this year to support our staff and ministries, maintain our technology infrastructure, and strengthen the security of Southview's network and systems. Many important improvements happen behind the scenes, but they help protect the church, reduce risk, and ensure our teams have reliable tools to carry out their work effectively.

ADMIN:

A huge thank you to Michele Black and the entire Admin team for the tremendous amount of work they do to support our pastors, staff, volunteers, and congregation. Their ability to anticipate needs, solve problems, coordinate countless details, and serve people with warmth and kindness has an impact across virtually every area of Southview.



OPERATIONS

FACILITIES: I am grateful for Mark, Kim, our custodial team, summer students, snow-removal and landscaping volunteers, and our Operations Security team. Much of their work happens quietly and often goes unnoticed, but every weekend service, ministry gathering, community event, meeting, and weekday program is made possible in part because of their faithful work!

HUMAN RESOURCES: I am so thankful for Mary Ellerby and the care and attention she brings to Human Resources at Southview. This year included significant work related to job postings and recruitment, interviews and onboarding, ongoing reviews and updates of HR policies, the digitization and organization of personnel records, and many of the day-to-day matters involved in caring well for a growing staff team.

Beyond the administrative responsibilities of HR, Mary continues to help us foster a healthy, safe, and supportive workplace where our staff can flourish and serve well.

FINANCE:

God has continued to demonstrate His faithfulness through the generosity of the Southview community.

I am deeply thankful for Linda Cooper who leads our Finance team, and for Clarisse as well as our faithful finance volunteers Fay and Cindy. I am also grateful for Brent Foster, who serves as our Treasurer and leads our Finance Committee. And a huge thank you to our Finance Committee members who give of their time and expertise to help us steward the finances of Southview in a wise and responsible manner.

And we are profoundly grateful for every person and family who faithfully gives to Southview. Your generosity makes ministry possible. Every dollar represents an opportunity to continue to grow and serve people, care for our staff and facility, invest in the next generation, reach our community, and participate in what God is doing locally and around the world.

God has been faithful in His provision, and we continue to trust Him as we seek to steward what He provides with wisdom and generosity.

FORWARD PROJECT:

One of the significant areas of work this year has been the continued development of the Forward Project.

We have been working alongside architects, fundraising consultants, our denominational district, staff, and volunteers as we continue planning for the proposed expansion of our current facility and begin discerning where a future Southview location might be established in south Calgary.



OPERATIONS

There is still much work and discernment ahead, but we are incredibly thankful for the team of staff and volunteers who have already invested significant time, expertise, prayer, and energy into the process.

We have also been deeply encouraged by the overwhelmingly positive response from the congregation following the initial introduction of the Forward Project at the end of May. It has been exciting to see people engage with the vision and begin imagining how God might use these next steps to create additional space for ministry here at our current location while extending Southview's ministry into another community.

We do not know every detail of what lies ahead, but we are excited to see where God leads. We will continue to plan carefully, listen prayerfully, and trust Him to provide what is needed at the right time.

As we look back over this past year, I am grateful for an Operations Team that understands that our work is about far more than buildings, budgets, technology, policies, or administration. Our desire is to steward them faithfully so that ministry can flourish, people can encounter Jesus, and together we can participate in God's Kingdom work.

It is a joy and privilege to serve. ■

Message from the Board of Elders

As I reflect on this past ministry year, my heart is filled with gratitude for what God has done in and through Southview. We have seen unmistakable evidence of the Holy Spirit at work—not through our own efforts, but through God’s faithfulness as He continues to draw people to Himself.

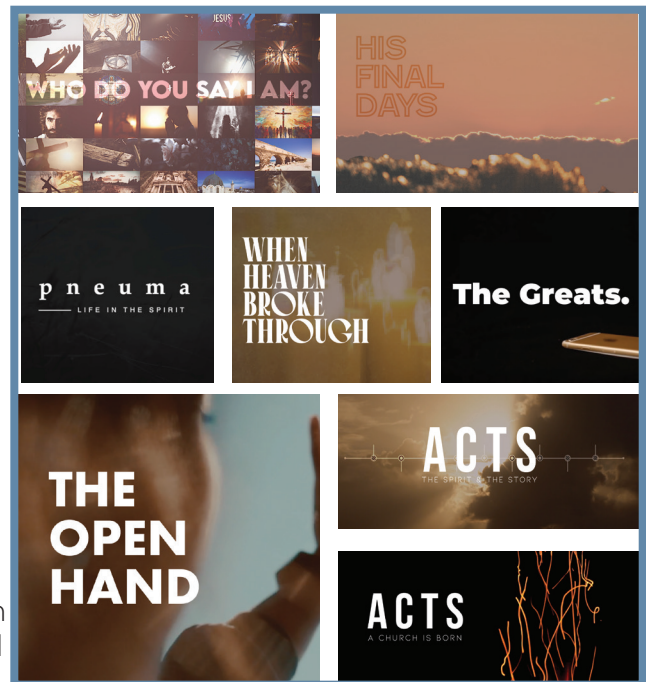

SERVICES AND GATHERINGS:

Together, we sang **102** different songs and journeyed through **8** sermon series - *Who Do You Say I Am?*, *Pneuma*, *The Greats*, *When Heaven Broke Through*, *Acts: A Church was Born*, *His Final Days*, *Acts: Spirit and the Story*, and *The Open Hand*.

Our Christmas and Easter gatherings were also significant moments in the life of our church. **2,974** people attended our five Christmas Eve services. **1,644** people gathered for our three Good Friday services, and **3,118** people attended our four Easter Weekend services, bringing our total Easter Weekend attendance to **4,762!**

During Lent, our church also responded with incredible generosity, giving **\$45,000** toward our project in support of Love One Another Foundation in Southeast Asia - far exceeding our goal of \$25,000.





Worship and Experience

ONLINE ENGAGEMENT:

We continued to reach beyond our physical gatherings with our YouTube channel and Podcast.

Our YouTube channel received **32,062** plays and gained **310** new subscribers. As of June 15, 2026, our podcast had been downloaded **11,525** times in more than **81** countries, with listeners from places including Canada, Singapore, the US, Vietnam, Germany, Hong Kong, Spain, Brazil, Nicaragua, and Argentina. It is encouraging to see how Southview continues to reach people well beyond our church walls.

BAPTISMS:

We have had **104** people baptized this year! It is always exciting to see people take that next step. We ran 3 classes and 2 baptism weekends plus our Pentecost weekend. We celebrate with them as their church family!

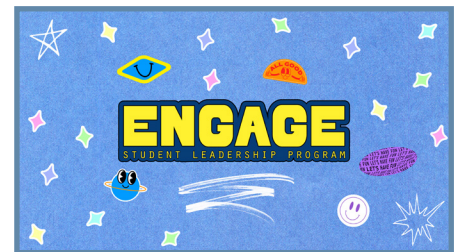


WEEKEND SERVICES

This year we saw another year of major growth in our kids area but we also saw God work in amazing ways by providing us wonderful and committed volunteers to see us through this growth period. Our volunteers, approximately **70** each weekend, seem to be connecting with each other and finding a sense of team together. We were able to split our classrooms into single grade groups instead of combined in Grade School and preschool was able to move the Kindergarten kids into their own space creating more room and more age appropriate teaching for each area. In Club 56 Malina worked directly with the volunteers in the classroom for many weekends which we saw pay off in the confidence of the volunteers and the engagement of our Club 56 kids. These kids have had thoughtful discussions and tons of fun all year!

ENGAGE

Engage is a leadership development program for students in Grades 4–6, giving them the opportunity to grow as leaders by serving in Children's Ministry. This year, we expanded the program to include Preschool and Tech, alongside our Kids Worship team. Each month, approximately **15** students gathered to learn what Christ-like leadership looks like, with practical training in the ministry area where they chose to serve



EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Trunk or Treat

Our Fall event brought nearly **1000** kids with their families. We had such creative trunks for kids to get treats from and lots of positive feedback from families who enjoyed the event.



Winter Carnival

A first time community/family event that brought over **200** kids and their families. The building was buzzing with energy and everyone was having a blast. We had face painting, indoor snowball fights, carnival games, preschool crafts and games, a candy bar, a hot chocolate bar and a wandering snowman! Feed back was very positive and we had some volunteers that had not volunteered at our events before so that was great too.



Family Experiences

We held our Advent and Easter Experiences again this year. Both events were attended by many first time families. We have been running this event for quite a few years now so it was nice to see so many families that had never attended the event before. We saw so many families engaged in the activities together.



Kingdom Quest Summer Camp

What a wonderful week of camp we had! We had over **200** kids and around **100** volunteers for the week.

This year's theme centered around Jesus as the light of the world. Kids spent their week in their groups learning the 5 bottom lines: Jesus is the Way, Jesus is With Me, Jesus is Alive, Jesus Makes Me New, and The Holy Spirit Helps Me. We also had about **25** preschoolers in their own little camp learning that Jesus helps them grow! Over the week we had two kids make decisions to follow Jesus and trust that seeds were planted for many more. ■

MINISTRY STORY

On April 11, **SEVEN** members of the 25–35 ministry spent an afternoon serving at the Salvation Army's Hope Market in Forest Lawn.

Hope Market is a new initiative that provides free groceries to families experiencing food insecurity. Designed to operate like a small grocery store, it allows families to choose food items that best meet their needs.



During our visit, Salvation Army staff shared stories of the significant impact the program is already having, particularly for large families who rely on the service. Our team helped sort donations, stock shelves, and complete inventory in preparation for the week ahead. Congregational Life

To grow deeper in prayer by recruiting and equipping more people in our Prayer Teams at Southview.

I give oversight to all our Congregational Ministries and the Staff connected with those ministries. You'll hear from Justine (Pastor of Spiritual Formation) and Fernando (Pastor of Small Groups and Men's Ministry) in their reports, so here's an overview of what has been happening from a staffing perspective in Congregational Life and through our Care Ministries this past year.

STAFFING:

Our Parish Nurse, Nadine Hunt, retired near the end of 2025 after 17 years of ministry with us at Southview. We sure appreciated Nadine's nursing skills and pastoral heart in our Care ministries over those years, and we knew her retirement would leave us in need. Thankfully, we were blessed to find 2 Nurses from within the Southview family, and we hired Jessica Berg and Judy Johnstone to share the role. They have entered seamlessly and we're so happy to have them on the team.

Our Small Groups and Men's Ministry Pastor, Fernando Ebanks, reduced his role to part time a couple of years ago, to start up his Counselling Practice called Ascent Counselling. Since then, Fernando's practice has continued to grow and this year we began discussing how he could continue to accommodate the growth of his practice and have him serve here at Southview. We agreed that another reduction in his role at Southview would work best for Fernando and for the church. As of Sept 1, Fernando will be our Pastor of Men's and Marriage Ministries, and we've hired a new Groups and Connections Pastor to take the portfolio of Small Groups from Fernando's responsibilities. Simon Martin joined us August 15 to take on this new role of Pastor of Groups and Connections. Simon and his family come to us from Kamloops Alliance Church where they served for the past 7 years or so.

CARE TEAMS:

Our Care Teams deliver most of the front-line Pastoral Care here at Southview. We have **53** volunteer Care Team members who are spread into **5** teams. Teams 1-4 commits one week a month to contact those in our church in need of care and connection due to life's challenges. Over the year these teams made **253** connections with congregants and provided prayer and encouragement through those connections. Our 5th team was new this year and they focused on contacting the more 'senior' population in our



church. They made **323** calls over the year and offered connection, support and prayer through those contacts.

SUPPORT GROUPS:

We offer the following support groups for prayer, encouragement and support for various life circumstances.

- Caregivers of Spouses with Dementia - meets monthly through the ministry year
- Grief Share – Fall and Winter session
- Divorce Care – Spring session
- The Sanctuary Course – Fall Session and an Alumni group that meets monthly

FUNERALS:

We hosted **9** funerals at Southview this year. Many are for our Southview families, and some are requests from the community. We have a great team of people that provide a sacred and safe ministry to those who are grieving.

AN EVENING OF REMEMBRANCE:

On December 1, 2025, we hosted our fourth annual Evening of Remembrance for anyone who lost a loved one in the past year or simply wanted to pause before the Christmas Season to remember a loved one who had passed any number of years ago. We had roughly **50** people attend, and it was a very meaningful service with music, testimony, encouragement from the Word, prayer, an invitation to light a candle of remembrance, and a reception afterwards.



SENIORS COFFEE CONNECTIONS:

This year we held **7** Seniors Coffee Connections with an average of **88** people per event and a team of **13** volunteers at each event to put together food, décor, music and tech. These have been great times of connection around tables, food, singing and a word from a speaker, or an interview with one of our pastoral staff.

PRAYER TEAM:

We have a team of **233** people who are part of our Prayer Team in Realm. Each week we send out prayer requests from people in our Southview Church Family asking for prayer. We also have a post service prayer team that is available to pray with people at the conclusion of our worship gatherings.

BENEVOLENT MINISTRY:

Our benevolent fund exists to provide practical help to people going through times of financial or personal struggle. We've been able to offer help to people over **300** times for things such as: Grocery gift cards, Rent and utilities, Counselling, Christmas Hampers/Gift Cards, Back to School assistance, our Meals Ministry team (every 2nd Friday they met to prepare and deliver meals), and Year End donations to Non-Profit Organizations in our city doing kingdom work. This year roughly **\$102,250.00** was distributed to these needs.

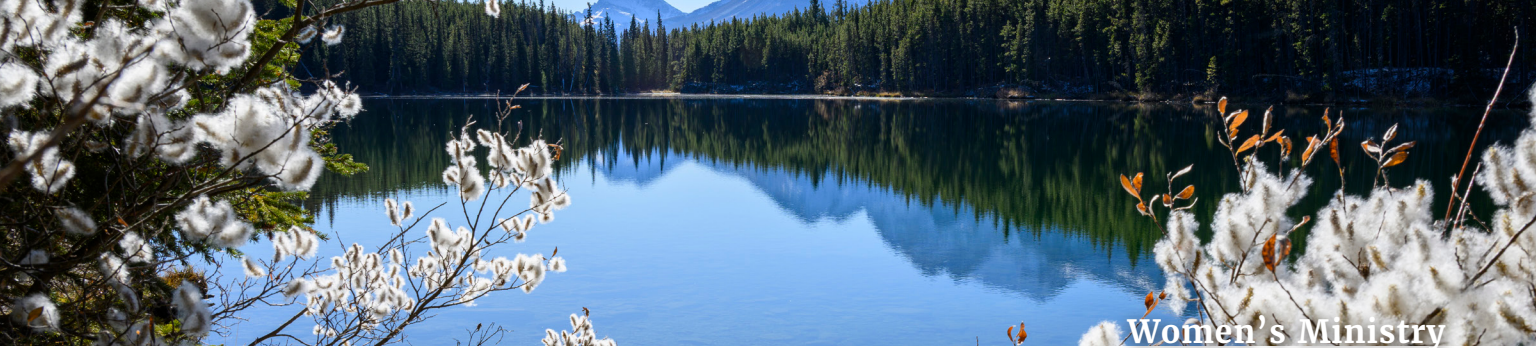

My uncle now pastors those congregations, while my sister serves as a pastor alongside my brother-in-law, who is the senior pastor of churches they planted in San Diego and Pasadena, California.

Because of this heritage, ministry has never simply been an activity for me. It has been a way of life. However, over the years I have learned that faith is not inherited, it must be personally owned. God has continued to deepen my dependence on Him and remind me that true leadership begins with humility, prayer, and obedience.

Today, God is teaching me to integrate faith into every aspect of life, including family, work, and ministry. I am grateful that my vocation allows me to serve the Christian community while also encouraging others

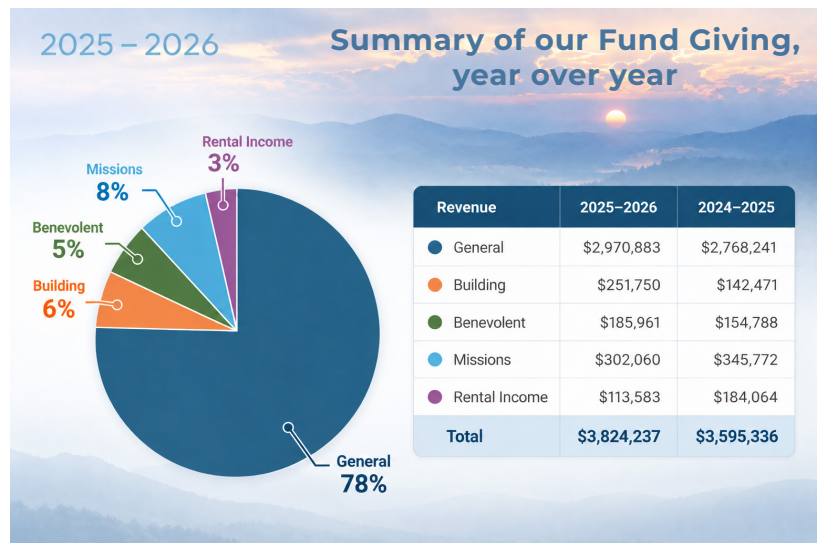
2025 – 2026 Financial Summary

We are pleased to report that through the detailed effort and support of staff and the Finance Committee, a clean Review Engagement Report was completed for the year ended June 30, 2026. Our year-end statements are prepared and reviewed by Dart Bryant, an external accounting firm that provides ongoing support throughout the year.

Our giving this ministry year was within 98.7% of our budget and 7.3% higher than the prior year. Our expenses over the year were significantly lower than budgeted which allowed us to address some deficiencies and upgrades to our facility of around \$106,872 in capital expenses and to continue to set funds aside for the extraordinary repairs.

Looking ahead for 2026-2027, our budget reflects the growth we have seen in our weekend gatherings. We've planned for a roughly 10% increase in giving over last year's budget and we are trusting God will continue to provide as we join in what He is doing in our midst.
